and we hove on the ropes all day Sunday and beside march foreteen miles the marching we done beforeday light and after sundowt at might you may believe we had a pretty hard days work for Sunday and it was hot enough to almost mell to man but we stood it first rate and the boys went into camp at 11 relock at nigh singing as thoug we had only march one or two males we have got so use to marching that it is not considered any great of to march 25 miles in a day this that weather as long as the knopacks are carried by the teams, I get along well enough for A have a house to side all of the time and when I get tired of rideing Jean get off and lett soul tired walking a rough My dutys are not verry hard now and Dean not complain I have to be on hand at all hours when wanted as I am all ways for duty I am allways around this morning to had to help mount the Grand Guard for pichel that is the most of have done to day I have a good Gergt Major and he does most of the runing while I do the writing are have lived first rate so far but dont effect to much langer for nothing is to be get except; what we carry along there is not a Dollars worth of Merchandise or gracerys in this

whole country excep that came throug with the Sutters with our train and with the men Our Brass Band is a great sight for the women here and a great many squads of them come in to camp to hear them play they never have seen or heard any thing of the kind before One woman cause in and said Provided like to hear them blow on them ere brass home right well, so I told the drim major to play a time which was done and it beat all she ever heard or ever thought of hearing and she went old and brought a big squad of other women and they had to have a little musick which amused them greatly and so it goes every day and it helps to amuse the men and keep then in good sperito, Since we have been here the people are returning to their homes from their hideing places where they drove by the reffels whor were conscripting every man they could find and freeing them against their will in to the rebbal ranks I this is the most loyal part of Difey that we have been in yet and it has suffered greatly and I tell you it makes me fell proud to thear them welcome is to their assistance They have been looking for us two years and we have not been able to get heret fefore Mow we are here the hurran for the union without fear one woman coine to will to see the amion
