Be for me I shall not attend for I have no inclination to participate in any thing of the kind whith out you and Ida not thik the looker fany one that where I ruff as Wentackey girls do

We have not done any thing since we got back from our scout but cleen up and keep cool Last night we had a Thunder shower and it rame hard for a while, I was a sleep when it came on and the first thing I heard was a clap of thunder wich sounded as though a 24 pound shell had bursted in my tent and thought the reso had attacked us till heard it rain. V received a letter from Frank day befor yesterday and Causeresed it resterday he is well, We are doing to march from thear again in a few days and where we will go too is were than I can tell think toward the Cumber and feer haps to the cumberland gap this is at sure work. but I think it is centain we are ong some where for last night I heard the col tell the officero that we would not stay here more wan five day to the outside as soon and find out where our destination is Dwell let you know you must not worry about me because. I go in to danger for. came down we for that and it would not work well to un now you had ought to De no double quick last sinday to get into a sight the way we went for three mile lode not slow lived when we got there we found a got lot of people going home from church which disappointed us considerable we went per the garand where there was a fight the

Sunday befor and such a stench of do not pount to smell again, after we found out our mistate we marched back about a mile to a cross road and camped in the edge of a woods so as not to show our selver and sent out Pickets to warm no of any approach if any so we would not be susprised, nothing deme along so the next after moon we marched back to our rendersons and returned to Glas gow the next day of we do not march we have a good camp were to stay in and if not do shall try and get a horse, to ride which I think · Pean There is not much news to write and no I write to often you must not expect much will mail it at Chestring so you will get it by Mail He went home on a Furlowigh and Attrought it as safe a way to send is as any and as sprick It is time you had it now, as he has been gone several days, Musan & think of your kind advise and your words are in my mind levery hour, and they stop me afterno in some of the temptations of the camp, which are not a few When hear any one swear Daronder wether he know what he is saying and co can not swear with at all now and I find I can get along as well just as well. I hope our resolution will be successful if so we can be hope

The camp is a hard place for a christian to live and very few can go throug this war with out getting more or less demorralised some do and a great many do not, and Of I do not get any worse I shall think I have stood if first rate. I suppose you are Conesome while I am away but you must not get dis couraged for it will not do Keep up your sperito and be a good Girl and I will help you all Dean do not hoorry about me my life is you must rember is ist gods hand and it is joist as safe as It would be at home - and you must rember that the comtry needs my services and Danus help her in the hour tokneed, and when the war is. over which signed be, before long of will return to you again with the satisfaction of knowing that Ilder my duty, to my country which A shall be proud of the rest of my life, Give my regards to Mer & Miro Davis and tell them that Sucut Dairs in well and also Mrs Delavergne if you see her that Sutisswell, asch have not room for much more It must bring this epistle to an end Give my Gove to all myaring friends and reserve your own share write soon and Direct as before My From Jour Most Coffeetionate Husband To Bend you a photograph of our adj't and his horse in another package Deck
