and sleft first rate and I did not camplet any cold either and we were out in a heavy rain the next day and at slight we reached Milasgow and camped on the Gair Grounds where we still are it is a nice place and full of shade trees like a grove better than our old campat Bowling Green Mears Brigaded with the 111 Ohis and our Col is in command of the Brigade Demi Brigade I have to act as Brigade Sergt Major and Rigtal Gergt Major to and lit Keeps me busy most of the time We were paid two months kay day before yesterday and Putil Levid you some shoney as

soon as Poan there is no Express office have and I hardly dar send it by mail and as som as fear twill send you some money Of there is any going home on a furlough in a fest days I will send it that just arrived and have just receive 2 letters one from you and one from Thrank Dam glad you are well and I hope you will allways be so Cot Hamilton is here now he arrived the other day Heis a good man and I leke him Arst rate Davis is well and so are the rest of us it is most time for Dress parade and it have got to stop writing, and Sulp the adjutant for in the

line on the Parade ground then for Jupper give my best respects to mrand fors Davis and all other friends and beleave me your mest Offictionale Husband I Maler Julet your letter to Glasgow Ky till fart or Orders I D Keeler Saryt mi
